Course Description The Doorways to Construction half year program is a highly practical one which is supported by theory and is designed for

students wishing to explore a career in the building and construction industry. The focus is on providing hands on practical experience in trade areas of carpentry and providing candidates with safety units preferred by employers. Student's complete competencies from the Construction Training package. High standards of safe work practices are expected and enforced throughout the course. All students are required to organize and participate in Structured Workplace Learning in

industry settings.

Pathways This course leads to Certificate III School Based Apprenticeships and full-time Apprenticeships.

Entry Requirements Genuine interest in the Construction Industry and sound literacy and numeracy skills. Students will need to have completed

CPCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry and CPCCWHS2001 Apply WHS requirements, policies

and procedures in the construction industry.

Other Requirements Students must supply their own steel cap boots and appropriate trade clothing.

Students and their families are responsible for organising 5 days of Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) in the

construction industry. The 5 days of SWL must be completed by the end of the Term 3 holidays.
